INCIDER'S VIEW

RASPUTIN AND THE II

The Apple II may be going, but it's not going easily or quickly.

Then we asked Contributing Editor Cindy Field to research new Apple II products announced in 1991, we expected to have a list of maybe 50 titles. We were shocked — pleasantly shocked — to see Cindy's whopping list of 150 new products. Okay, some of them are upgrades and some aren't exactly headline grabbers. Still, this month's cover story shows that there's life in them thar' Apple IIs. And while there's no reason to believe that 1992 won't yield another

sizable crop of products, you can't help but wonder when Apple will officially call an end to the manufacturing and sale of the II.

Unfortunately, it's clear that Apple has no intention of resuscitating the II line. We enjoyed the rumors of a new beefed-up GS that would be sold through channels other than the traditional Apple dealer network. And we were disappointed to discover that while a new machine was more than speculation and plans were being laid for the cheaper and better GS, Apple executives eventually quashed it. Upper management undoubtedly realized that

the GS on the drawing board would be a threat to the Mac LC. They were right; it would have been.

So with no new CPU planned and dismal dealer and developer support getting even worse, what's left for the Apple II but to go gentle into that good night?

The Apple II may be going, but it's not going easily or quickly. Like Rasputin, the monk whose legendary mystical powers made him one of the most influential figures of the Russian Revolution, the Apple II just doesn't want to die. Rasputin survived poison and bullets, but was finally

done in by a combination of a second round of gunshots, clubbing, and drowning. History tells us that Rasputin — poisoned, shot, beaten, and bound — was dumped through the ice into the Neva River. When the body was finally discovered, the lungs were filled with water and he had managed to somehow get a hand free before he died.

To me that's the image that personifies the Apple II. You'd have to be blind to not see that it's going down, but it's certainly not going down without a fight. The Apple II has also survived a lot, and, inevitably, the fatal blow to the II comes not from users, developers, or the press, but from Apple itself. You have to wonder how long the II could have prospered had Apple shown even a modicum of support for it.

We expect that Apple will praise but bury the Apple II shortly. In fact, some official pronouncement may have come by the time you read this. The important thing to remember, however, is that while Apple may not recognize the II anymore, that doesn't mean the developers that produced the 13 pages of new products listed on page 42 will suddenly stop making software.

As for inCider/A+, even though we added Mac coverage a year ago, we remain dedicated to providing information on the Apple II. In addition to our ongoing monthly coverage of AppleWorks and Publish It!, we'll report on System 6.0 for the GS when it's released, as well as Hyper-Studio 3.0 and other Apple II products, such as Westcode's Pointless, which in short is Adobe Type Manager for the GS. What we won't do is treat Apple II users as if they're stranded on a desert island. Apple IIs and Macs work side by side in schools and small businesses across the country. Educators, in particular, want to know how the two computers complement one another.

But even if you're not an educator and have no interest in Mac/II connectivity, expect new products for the II in 1992. The six million Apple IIs out there won't go away after Apple announces the end of the line. The installed base of IIs is large enough to warrant further development as long as those millions of Apple II users continue to buy software and peripherals. \Box







INSIDER'S VIEW

HIS LETTER IS IN RESPONSE TO "Reality Check" (inCider's View, September 1991, p. 8). I'm glad to see that Mr. Muse isn't naive enough to believe that all schools are showcases of technology. Many in the computer/education industry aren't as aware. But Mr. Muse's desire to have school systems spend more money on technology seems rather self-serving. After all, if it weren't for the dollars spent on educational computing, inCider/A+would probably cease to exist.

My career also depends on the use of computers in education, and it has for over ten years. As a parent and taxpayer, however, I question many schools' use of this technology. Similarly to Mr. Muse, I was at the National Educational Computing Conference (NECC) in Phoenix, and saw the technology being promoted. The experience was discouraging. Everyone seemed to be admiring the latest technological toy.

I don't want my children using junk technology in the classroom, just as I don't want them eating junk food in the cafeteria. And I certainly don't want to see any tax money spent on technology that will turn our schools into carnivals. Some of this hardware and software will make excellent tools for library research when sufficient reference materials exist to make them practical. Most of the technology, though, distracts the students from the hard work of learning. I'd rather my children learn to calculate MPG than produce MTV.

Instead of buying more hardware and software for schools, let's learn to use the existing technology effectively. Every day I see school computer labs that are nothing more than electronic babysitters. I can relate to Mr. Muse's astonishment on hearing about a school purchasing an Apple IIe without planning for its implementation. I hear frequently of district technology coordinators who buy labs of Macintosh LCs without planning for their

implementation. It seems as though some computers serve as status symbols rather than educational tools. I agree that we should "apply pressure on local, district, state, and federal levels." The message, however, shouldn't be to spend more — it should be to spend wisely.

We agree with you that giving out money blindly is no way to solve this problem. We don't agree, though, that our nation's teachers have enough hardware and software, and therefore should simply get to work using it. Until school systems, educators, parents, and students recognize that computers are valuable educational tools, this

kind of technology won't carry the same weight in the classroom as other tools, such as textbooks. When the school system's decision makers believe that computers are nothing more than status symbols and toys, no one in the school plans properly for the machines' integration into curricula.

So by all means, push for careful planning in your school district. You should demand to know who will use the equipment and how. Make sure that your educators are fully trained and can use these new tools. But denying teachers (and therefore our children) access to the wonders of the Information Age is intellectual suicide.

That means that animation has come to some *Far Side* cartoons. Not only will your Mac offer you a chuckle a day, some of those cartoons will be moving. You can


expect *The Far Side* in motion to be as weird as you can imagine. "The thought of the things I draw actually starting to move,"







GOING TO WORK

The IIGS has a powerful toolbox, but learning to use it takes some elbow grease.

BOX O' TOOLS

UNDERSTAND THAT THE APPLE IIGS comes with a powerful toolbox. What is it and how can I access it?

The Apple IIGS Toolbox is a GS/OS resource that lets programmers create software that conforms to Apple's Human Interface standards. The "tools" are specialized routines that handle everything from creating menus to drawing windows to managing input from the mouse and keyboard. If you're familiar with Applesoft BASIC, these tools are much like BASIC commands. You pass them a set of parameters, and they perform a desired action based on those parameters.

These routines are described in detail in the Apple IIGS Toolbox Reference, a threevolume series available either from Addison-Wesley (Jacob Way, Reading, MA 01867, 800-447-2226) or at your local bookstore (\$26.95 each, volumes 1 and 2, \$39.95 for volume 3). If you can get ahold of a copy of Dan Gookin and Morgan Davis' Mastering the Apple HGS Toolbox (out of print, but published originally by Compute!, P.O. Box 5406, Greensboro, NC 27403, 919-275-9809) or Mark Andrews' Programming the Apple IIcs in C or Assembly Language (also out of print, but published originally by Howard W. Sams & Company, 11711 North College, Carmel, IN 46032, 800-428-5331), either of those books will also get you up and running.

I should warn you that using the toolbox isn't easy. If you truly want to tackle it, you should be familiar already with assembly language,

Pascal, or C. If you know only BASIC, though, and are really determined, you can use So What Software's Call Box, a BASIC compiler that lets you access the GS toolbox (10221 Slater Ave., Suite 103, Fountain Valley, CA 92708, 714-964-4928, \$110).

There are also programs available that make talking to the GS Toolbox easier by letting you "draw" your desktop, complete with menus and dialog boxes. These programs then generate source code automatically for the environment you've created. Genesys (Simple Software Systems International, 4612 North Landing Drive NE, Marietta, GA 30066, 404-928-4388, \$150) and Design Master (The ByteWorks, 4700 Irving Blvd. NW, Suite 207, Albuquerque, NM 87114, 505-898-8183, \$95) are two such programs. (See our comparative review in April 1991, p. 34, for details.)

One way to learn to use the toolbox is to develop a skeleton desktop program that you can then fill out and modify to your specific needs. Dr. Sandy Mossberg described this procedure in a five-part series of articles; the first three parts were published in the last three issues of the now defunct Call-A.P.P.L.E. magazine. Having been its technical editor, I have the complete series of articles in both assembly language and C on disk. If you'd like a copy, send \$20 to me at inCider/A+'s address, listed below.

JOYSTICK ADJUSTMENT

HAVE A NUMBER OF JOYSTICKS (Gravis, Apple, and so on) for my Apple IIGS. How can I check to see whether they're centered properly?

Michael Hudson Portland, OR Michael, I really tried to re-invent the wheel on this one. I had a page-long beauty of an answer all worked out, complete with oscilloscopes and ohmmeters. My thanks goes to Christopher Allen (a.k.a. NonaDAbov2 on America Online) for clearing the air. According to Mr. Allen, all you have to do is run this simple program from Applesoft BASIC:

10 HOME

20 X = PDL(0): Y = PDL(1)

30 PRINT X,Y

40 GOTO 20

The value range for the joystick is between 0 and 255; about 127 means it's centered perfectly. Most software isn't too picky, so anywhere within 5 to 10 percent of that should be good enough. Press CTRL-C to stop the program.

ACCIDENTAL DELETION

RECENTLY DELETED A FILE accidentally. I had to re-key the entire document, which took a lot of time and proofreading. Can you "undelete" a file?

Detroit, MI

First, immediately stop using the disk from which you deleted the file. If you continue, you'll need a lot of luck to find the file intact. When a file is deleted, its data remains on disk until another program's data replaces it. The operating system deletes the file only by removing its entry in a directory block.

I know of a couple of software packages that undelete a file. **ProSEL** by Glen Bredon is a powerful program selector that lets you move quickly from one application to another (distributed by Charlie's Apple Seeds, 9081 Hadley Place, San Diego, CA 92126, 619-566-1297, \$40). It includes utilities to copy, move, delete and undelete files, and format disks.

You could also try Central Point Software's Copy II+, which copies disks and handles other file-maintenance tasks (15220 Northwest Greenbrier Parkway, #200, Beaverton, OR 97006, 503-690-8090, \$39.95). The program is also available from mail-order houses.





GRAPHICS DECODER

If you think understanding graphics formats is like reading hieroglyphics, have we got some utilities for you.

GRAPHICS IMAGES HAVE BUILT bridges between people for centuries. After all, the ancient Egyptians wrote with icons, not an alphabet. Even today art spans the communication gap between 20th-century minds. If you use a personal computer, you know the vital role graphics plays on your screen. Even when you're working mostly with words, pictures amplify the signal you're trying to send.

If you can move graphics between computers, between the Apple II and the Mac, say, you open up once-closed tombs of artwork on each machine. Desktop-published documents can sparkle when you shift Mac art to the GS. Mac projects are easier when you use art created on the Apple II as a foundation, then expand on it with more

sophisticated drawing and painting tools. Whether you're swapping art in the class or at home, the Apple II-to-Mac connection is alive and well, thanks to several outstanding utilities.

To some users the computer world's graphics formats seem as indecipherable as the symbols on an ancient pyramid's walls. Mac pictures come coded with names such as EPS, TIFF, and PICT. Apple II art comes wrapped in hi-res, double-hi-res, super-hi-res, and Print Shop formats, among others. IBM PCs, Amigas, Commodore 64s, and Atari STs all own peculiar graphics identities. How can you share anything when everything's so confusing?


GIF it. *Graphics-interchange format* provides a way to swap pictures from one computer to another, often with little or no loss of color or clarity. Created by Compu-

Serve, the on-line-service giant, GIF bridges the graphics gap between different machines and incompatible paint programs.

To make the exchange, you need a translation utility on both ends of the bridge. If you're moving art from a Mac LC to an Apple IIGS, for instance, both machines require their own specific software. On the Mac it's called GIFConverter, a \$40 piece of shareware you can download from most on-line services and many bulletin boards. At the other end of the GIF food chain, the GS needs SuperConvert, a \$40 commercial utility published by Seven Hills Software. You may be familiar with this product's original incarnation, SHRConvert, which was a shareware utility offered on on-line services and bulletin boards. Super-Convert loads 16 more file formats than its shareware original, lets you manipulate the image at will, and includes poster printing and desktop-art generation.

Let's say you have a color illustration you've created with **Easy Color Paint** on the Mac. You've saved the graphics image as a PICT file, and you're ready to take it to the GS. The procedure, though time-consuming, is pretty straightforward.

From the Mac, run GIFConverter. When the program's menu

bar appears, open the PICT document, then save it as a GIF-format file (Figure 1). Is it ready to take to a GS now? Not quite. You can't simply put that GIF file on a floppy disk and expect the Apple II to make sense of it. Just as with any Mac/II data-sharing scenario, you've got to get the file from one machine to the other. Two methods — networking and telecommunications — work best.

If both machines are on an AppleTalk network and the Mac is running System 7.0, you can stick the GIF file in a shared folder, then retrieve it once you're in front of the GS. (See "Long Live 7.0," August 1991, p. 24, for details on operating a System 7.0-equipped network.) An AppleShare-driven network, common in schools but uneconomical at home, handles such transfers, too. (See "In the Network Groove," September 1991, p. 40, for information on classroom-based networks.)

If long distance separates the two machines — perhaps the Mac is at school, but you'd like to play with the image on the GS at home — telecommunications may serve you better. Assuming you have modems at both computers and a membership in an on-line service such as America Online, you can simply send yourself a message, appending the GIF file to the electronic letter. From the home GS you reconnect to America Online, read your mail, and download the file to your II.




Figure 2. Use SuperConvert on your GS to remap a Macintosh graphics image.

With the file available to the GS, Super-Convert handles the rest. Pick Computer Independent and GIF as the loading file format, then remap the image (Figure 2). Super-Convert offers plenty of options, from graphics modes and palettes to pattern dithering and automatic clipping. Super-hi-res 320-by-200 mode gives the best results most of the time, especially with color images, but 640-by-400 mode should be your choice when you're dealing with gray-scale images.




Figure 3. Macintosh version of a GIF image.

Depending on the size and complexity of the image, the translation can take anywhere from a moment to a couple of minutes as SuperConvert distills the graphic into something the GS comprehends. That often means a loss of detail and color, but the results can still be stunning. **Figures 3** and **4**, for example, show the Mac and GS versions, respectively, of the same GIF image of the Voyager spacecraft.

Most GIF pictures gleaned from a service such as America Online translate perfectly with SuperConvert or GIF-Converter. Occasionally, though, a downloaded GIF file won't show up when you select that format within SuperConvert. Images pulled from the Mac software libraries of America Online for translation on the GS are particularly troublesome. The fix, fortunately, is simple.

Look through the Apple II software collection for The Stripper, a short shareware program. Stripper removes the file header—usually a group of 32 bytes that identifies the file as Mac—which causes the confusion. (If you run Stripper on a GIF file and it tells you that the file has no header, type 20 in response to the strip-to-byte request and the offending bytes will be erased.)

Playing around with the image on the receiving end is worth your while. With SuperConvert you can map and remap the image in memory easily, first trying one setting — 640-by-400 mode with a calculated palette, and pattern dithering turned on, perhaps — then another. Experiment and you'll discover quickly the optimum settings for the bulk of your translations.

If you're shifting pictures from the GS to the Mac, GIFConverter offers plenty of tools on its end, too. At the click of the mouse you can flip from color to gray scale and back, or change resolution, number of colors, and palette.

GS users aren't the only Apple II aficionados who can swap pics. **IIGIF**, yet another shareware utility created by Jason Harper,

author of SHRConvert and SuperConvert, translates GIF files into several 8-bit Apple II graphics formats. Though naturally cruder in interface and operation than its slick GS cousin, IIGIF twists a GIF file into




Figure 4. GS version of the same GIF image.




Figure 5. 140-by-192 resolution makes some Apple II illustrations look blocky and abstract.

double-hi-res (both black-and-white and color) or hi-res (again, color or monochrome) images. The results range from the impressive to the not-so-pretty. The fault lies in the older Apple graphics limitations. Double-hi-res color images are strangled by their puny 140-by-192 resolution. Compared to art processed on the Mac or GS, 8-bit II illustrations look blocky, scattered, and nearly abstract. (Figure 5).

Originals with tighter resolutions — 320by-200 mode images - and bright, primary colors come through fine. Detailed pictures created in higher resolutions translate adequately only when you drop the color and go for 560-by-192 mode in blackand-white double-hi-res.

Remember, you may need to run Stripper to discard the header on incoming files before running them through HGIF, especially if they're arriving from a Macintosh graphics collection.

Bridging the graphics gap can be more than swapping GS and Mac images, of course. Not only are other computers'

paint programs fair game, but you may want to span different generations of Apple II art, too. SuperConvert is a good pick for the former, because it can directly translate images created by such disparate machines as the Amiga and the IBM PC for you to use on your GS.

The best place to pick up such images is on the various telecommunications services and bulletin boards. You can skim an IBM PC graphics library, for example, select some .PCX format artwork, download it to your GS, and process it with SuperConvert or GIFConverter. Images built in the PC's 16-color EGA mode translate quite well to the GS' 320-by-200 16color super-hi-res format, while PC 256color VGA art looks great on a color Macintosh such as the LC.

You can load most of the common graphics-file formats into SuperConvert. But what if you're trying to get something to the Mac, instead? GIFConverter is more of a GIF viewer than anything else, because it doesn't make provisions for reading alien file formats. If you have a GS handy, the solution is simple: Just import the file with SuperConvert, turn it into a GIF file to retain color, and move it to the Macintosh where you can transform it into a format your paint program accepts, such as PICT.

INSIDE APPLE

The Apple world isn't much easier on graphics — it has more than a dozen different formats to worry about. You could use SuperConvert to turn double-hires pictures into super-hi-res fit for GS paint programs, but if you move graphics across Apple-to-Apple bridges frequently, you'll be better off with Roger Wagner Publishing's The Graphics Exchange for the GS. Don't bother with it if you're

moving from Mac to Apple II or back - it can read only Mac-Paint-format images. Though MacPaint is the oldest graphics




Figure 6. The Graphics Exchange works under a menuand-mouse interface.

style in the Macintosh world, its blackand-white limitations are out of date in a colored computing world.

But if you've got a slew of Apple II images you want to share, TGE can't be beat. Supporting 19 Apple II and Macintosh graphics formats — from the lowly lo-res to the super 640-by-200 super-hires - TGE works under a menu-andmouse GS/OS interface. (See Figure 6.) You pick the original format, select the image you want to transform, and decide on the destination format. Then click away.

Unlike SuperConvert, TGE processes batches of graphics in a single session. With it you can quickly turn those scads of Apple II double-hi-res Dazzle Draw images into something that Platinum Paint recognizes.

Or you can select just a piece of any image and translate that part into any other format - something that's especially handy when you want to create Print Shop or Print Shop GS clip art from bits and pieces of larger images.

TGE's extras are impressive. As you process graphics, you can mask out colors in the original selectively before translation takes place. If you have a brilliant picture of a bright blue Mustang on a dark-brown background, but you want only the car, you can eliminate everything but the car's colors easily.

LEND A HAND

Helping hands are all around. Apple File Exchange, the file-translation and transfer utility bundled with the Macintosh system software, lets you shift Apple IImade GIF files to the Macintosh, and Macintosh GIF and Mac-Paint files to the Apple II. Save the GIF files to a ProDOS 3.5-inch disk. run the Apple File Exchange program on the Mac, stick the disk into the Macintosh's internal floppy drive, and turn Apple II files into Macintosh format or Mac into ProDOS. (You still must run GIFConverter to com-

plete the transformation from Apple II image to Macintosh compatible, or SuperConvert or IIGIF on the Apple side to spin Mac images into II pictures.)


Individual paint programs make allowances for selected foreign formats, too. Platinum Paint, for instance, imports MacPaint files directly (though it can't work with them unless you've run them through Apple File Exchange and they're on a ProDOS disk). Studio 8, a color Macintosh paint program from Electronic Arts, loads and understands Deluxe Paint II GS-formatted files. And The Graphics Exchange even reads 400K and 800K Macintosh floppies directly, saving you the step through Apple File Exchange if you're moving MacPaint pics to the GS.

MAKE THE MOST OF IT

Moving graphics from place to place, whether between Apple IIs or from Apple IIs to Macs, may get quirky - the machines suffer from a plague of file formats - but the rewards are great, and great looking.

Build a bridge with pictures between the Apple II and the Macintosh, and you'll get twice the art for half the work. Even Michelangelo wouldn't have passed up that deal.







HARMONIE VS. INDEPENDENCE

hat's all the excitement about Seven Hills Software's Independence v.1.0 and Vitesse's Harmonie v.2.0 printer drivers? Independence and Harmonie provide IIGs owners with GS/OS drivers for cheap, high-quality laser, ink-jet, and Epson-compatible 24-pin dot-matrix printers. Excitement enough? Be still, my beating heart! Until now, IIGs owners had to make do with average dot-matrix or noisy letter-quality-style printers. But luckily for us, GS/OS is a modular

operating system, which you can update easily with driver software, such as printer drivers. Enter Vitesse and Seven Hills Software. With Independence or Harmonie installed, the IIGS will provide 300-dpi-quality (dots per inch) text or graphics objects from a variety of printers. Three hundred dpi isn't as sharp as commercial output, but it's certainly adequate for correspondence, desktop-publishing projects, and simple graphics presentations.

THE CONTENDERS

Independence v.1.0 is the original release of GS/OS DeskJet, LaserJet IIP, and LaserJet III printer drivers from Seven Hills Software. The package contains two disks and a well-written 65-page manual. One disk contains system files with printer drivers, a printtest new desk accessory (NDA), Apple's installer program, and installer scripts.

Font.Disk.3 contains 9- to 96point Times and Helvetica font files and demo versions of Disk Access NDA and Font Factory GS.

Harmonie v.1.0 was the first release of high-resolution GS/OS printer drivers. Harmonie v.2.0, which is now shipping, fixes quirks in v.1.0, adds several new drivers and features, and is free to owners of v.1.0. Harmonie comes on a single disk and includes a 10-page documentation file, which complements the original 10-page manual.

Harmonie v.1.0 provided drivers for the LaserJet II and III, DeskJet, PaintJet, "new" Epson LQ printers, enhanced ImageWriter II drivers, highspeed port drivers for the

ProGrappler, Grappler+, and Parallel-Pro parallel-interface cards, and the 19,200-baud port driver for GS/OS v.5.02 and 5.03. (GS/OS v.5.04 comes equipped with a high-speed port driver.)

The Harmonie v.2.0 upgrade adds drivers for the DeskJet 500's extra fonts, the LaserJet and LaserJet II, Okimate 20,

COMMON FEATURES

Independence and Harmonie have a number of features in common. Either one lets you select a page's orientation and choose the paper type, the character height and aspect ratios (the printout's width and height), and the quality (75, 150, and 300 dpi) of the printout. Both let you determine the number of copies and pages to print; choose a forward or reverse printing order; select odd pages, even pages, or all pages to print; advance the printer with auto or manual paper feed (it'll pause between pages); or use a "save ink" feature. Independence also lets you make collated copies.

Harmonie v.2.0 sports a number of additional features, including a 100-dpi print setting, internal or external rendering (using bit-mapped or built-in fonts), compression (speeds data transmission, slows processing), unidirectional printing (for dot-matrix printers), and an additional print menu. This print menu hosts selections such as shading, contrast and brightness controls, dithering (checkerboard for color and half-tone for gray-scale prints), and RGB sliders (with a range of 1 to 400 percent).

TO THE TEST

I evaluated the accelerated and unaccelerated print speed and quality of Independence and Harmonie at 75-, 150-, and 300-dpi settings. To compare text output, I used Softdisk GS' Wordworks with a 2148-word sample of the United States Constitution. To test graphics, I used Beagle Bros' Platinum Paint and chose a gray-scale picture of Saturn. The results of the speed test, summarized in the accompanying **Table**, put Harmonie out in front of Independence.

Acceleration provided an advantage of up to one minute of printing time at 300dpi text resolution, and up to three-andone-half minutes at 300-dpi graphics resolution, but significantly less at 150 and 75 dpi. Harmonie enjoyed a 10- to 75-second time advantage over Independence throughout the test. Unlike Harmonie, Independence can't use a printer's internal fonts.

Both Independence and Harmonie use a font bit map four times larger than that requested to produce 300 dpi, and twice the size of the font requested to produce 150-dpi resolution. The font desk included with Independence provides the fonts required to print properly right out of the shrink wrap, but you'll need to look elsewhere for some additional point sizes in your preferred font(s) to get the most out of Harmonie.

Both packages provide excellent 300-dpi text quality and good 150-dpi output. Independence's text looked just a bit better, especially at 150 dpi, but Harmonie had the edge in graphics output and was compatible with everything I tested.

WHEREVER YOU GO

I tested AppleWorks GS, Paintworks Plus, Platinum Paint, BeagleDraw, Graphic-Writer III v.1.0, and Wordworks for compatibility with Harmonie and Independence. (Program-compatibility notes

sliders on the alternate print menu to extreme values on AppleWorks GS v.1.1. After being reset once, this doesn't recur.

Seven Hills Software and Vitesse have a good reputation for upgrades and customer support. No major upgrade is planned for Independence v.1.0, but Seven Hills will be adding a 57.6-kilobaud IIGs port driver for the DeskWriter and PaintWriter. Vitesse has added a number of features and a lot of flexibility to Harmonie v.2.0 already.

IN CONCLUSION

I'm impressed with both printer-driver packages. Incompatibilities are minor and both products produce top-quality text and graphics images from any GS/OS desktop program. Independence will have you ready to go with text output almost immediately after you take it out of the box, but overall Harmonie comes out on top with the highest speed, drivers, largest number of drivers and features, and the better compatibility of the two products.

are included with both programs.) With some exceptions, printing worked well.


Independence couldn't print 300-dpi graphics with Platinum Paint, nor could I get it to print collated, even, or odd copies in AppleWorks GS 1.1. There were also a number of compatibility problems with GraphicWriter III v.1.0 (apparently resolved with v.1.1). Harmonie's only major problem was that it set the color





With Apple and IBM getting cozy these days, it may seem like heated battles are a thing of the past. Not so! They've just moved to the integrated-software arena, where everybody seems to be taking on Microsoft's war-horse, Microsoft Works.

The major contenders include Symantec's GreatWorks, Beagle Bros' BeagleWorks, and Claris Corporation's ClarisWorks. At press time, though, GreatWorks had at least one indisputable advantage: It's the only one that's already available to the public. Symantec is even offering AppleWorks and Microsoft Works users a \$99 "tradeup." Call the company for details.

LET'S GET INTEGRATED

There are two kinds of computer users in the world: those who swear by integrated software and those who swear at it. Mac users in the former group, who haven't had a choice in this area up to now, would do well to take a look at GreatWorks.

GreatWorks comes on four floppy disks, and you install it via a custom installer. Along with the application itself, you get help, spelling, and translator (XTND and Symantec) files. The application itself consists of eight modules: word processing, database, spreadsheet, charting, paint, draw, outliner, and communications. This count is three more than Microsoft Works,

which lacks the graphics modules, and two more than AppleWorks GS, which lacks the charting and outlining capabilities. (Apple-Works 3.0 provides only word-processing, database, and spreadsheet features.)

All modules have on-line and balloon help under System 7.0. Symantec's "CORE technologies" (cooperative-resource technologies) cover the application features the different modules share, such as file translation and the handling of text and objects. Don't let the fancy term intimidate you; it's just a complex phrase that means you have to learn program fundamentals only once for all eight modules, and you can access features such as the spelling checker from all parts of the GreatWorks program.

GreatWorks' file-translation capabilities are much more extensive than those of the existing competition. The application comes with both Claris XTND and Symantec translators, and GreatWorks can import AppleWorks and AppleWorks GS, Microsoft Works and Word (Mac and DOS formats), MacWrite, WordPerfect, Excel, RTF, Acta, and WriteNow files. You must open files formatted in programs other than Great-Works from the application's main window, rather than within a module.

Both data and text are preserved during translation, but some formatting (such as Word tables and Excel formulas) are lost. This isn't uncommon when importing and exporting files between applications. I ran into an anomaly with the Word translators: GreatWorks opened a Word 4 file just fine, but when I saved in Word format, the program said *Exporting data to Word 3.0*. You'll find both Word 3.0 and Word 4.0 translator files.

Symantec has designed each of the GreatWorks modules to bee similar to the more popular Macintosh stand-alone applications in each of the eight areas. The word-processing module is perhaps the closest to a full-featured stand-alone product. It supports multiple columns, date and time stamping, and a range of text styles. There's a select-all command that highlights all text in a document automatically, and a copy-ruler command, such as the one in MacWrite. The module also includes a number of predefined key commands (keyboard shortcuts), which are listed in the manual and in the on-line help.

You can set paragraph indentations and spacing via a special dialog box or the traditional ruler. GreatWorks also supports user-definable, dimensional sizing for graphics.

Full word-processing functions are available in the outliner module, as well. It has a click-and-drag approach to topic/subtopic arrangement and permits up to 15 topic levels in six styles. I found the click-and-drag function an improvement over traditional cut-and-paste methods.

The GreatWorks database module can accommodate any file size you can fit on your hard disk, and an unlimited number of records. There are eight field types and more than 100 preset calculation and summary functions. The program supports multiple-criteria sorts, selection, and retrieval, and the module includes a full-featured form generator. The wordprocessing module includes a mail-merge function that lets you merge database information into a word-processing document. Spell checking, find-andreplace, and date- and-time-stamping features are among the CORE technologies and are available in the database module.

The 256-column-by-16,384-row spreadsheet allows ascending and descending sorts over any number of columns and rows. Text styles are supported and you can move from this module to the *Chart* module via the *Window* menu. You have access to eight chart types — two picture charts, plus pie, scatter, bar, line, column, and area graphs. You also have access to fonts, styles, type sizes, and colors, as well as pattern styles for the various chart elements.

The graphics modules — Paint and Draw — aren't going to put FreeHand or MacDraw out of business, but they're solid, useful programs with more features than you may expect. The Paint module offers eight different modes, 14 paint tools, custom patterns, and a "transformation" menu including stretch, fill, inversion, and scaling options. The Draw module has nine tools, including freehand and group options, and you can zoom in on your work up to 800 percent.

The only module I find less useful than its full-featured counterpart is the communications program, chiefly because of the absence of scripts for automatic log-on/log-off. You can save access phone numbers as documents, however. On line this module



worked smoothly and was easy enough to set up. It appeared to be faster on screen than my regular telecom program, but a problem arose during a download: I got a number of *Checksum error* notifications when using the 1K block option to try downloading a file. Without this option, the file would have taken more than 35 minutes to download, according to Great-Works. With it (in another program), the file downloaded in around 12 minutes.

Overall, GreatWorks' feature list stacks up more than favorably against both Microsoft Works and AppleWorks/Apple-Works GS. And the interface and help functions are more attractive and accessible. The CORE-technology features, the modules' wider scope, and a more consistent, user-friendly interface make Great-Works an excellent choice for new Mac users in particular.

For many people, the modules in this package will be all they'll ever need. This is a software package — and category — that will merit closer attention.

First impressions can be deceiving: That bit of folk wisdom seems to apply to Amazing Window, a fast, flexible, feature-filled "electronic gradebook" from Kitchen Sink Software. Even with this in mind, the homely Shop Assistant Collection System (SAC) that appears in 40-column uppercase text when you initially boot this

gradebook disk, will surprise you.

SAC is an easy-to-use program selector that launches Amazing Window and any other Kitchen Sink Software products you may have used it to collectively install on a single 3.5-inch disk or hard disk. But while SAC may be a boon to loyal Kitchen Sink Software customers who are trying to bypass the floppy-disk shuffle, teachers who don't use the company's other products (or large-capacity drives for that matter) may feel unnecessarily inconvenienced as they consider whether or not to "UNSAC" a working copy of the program disk — in effect removing the SAC Applications menu to start the gradebook program directly.

That said, I want to emphasize how impressed I was by Amazing Window itself. Although essentially text-screen-based, this gradebook program incorporates an abundance of pop-up menus that boast handsome inverse video borders. These finishing touches may not constitute a true GUI (graphical user interface), but they add a satisfying, almost contemporary look and feel to Kitchen Sink's new teacher's assistant on disk. (For this review, I evaluated versions 1.5 and 1.7.1.)

What's more, AppleWorking educators will find Amazing Window easy to get along with. Many program commands perform functions similar to those in AppleWorks: Open apple-F (OA-F) finds students, for example, while OA-S saves your gradebook to a data disk located in a drive you select. The program formats disks, too.

You'd guess correctly if you assumed that OA-P prints gradebook-related reports such as Daily Attendance, Class Summary, Incomplete Assignments, Student Codes, and Report Cards. A newly implemented OA-H command lets you print a spreadsheet-like version of the grade information appearing on screen. According to the company, Amazing Window supports all 80-column printers.

The company also provides a preformatted worksheet to help you track attendance and assignments. Just print the worksheet (it lists students' names) and make photocopies, then organize the copies in a three-ring binder or notebook. Substitute the computer-generated version for your off-the-shelf class register. Amazing Window's data-entry screen may remind you of a typical rows-and-columns spread-

sheet, but this one's a lot more helpful. The upper right-hand corner of the screen displays a list of the commands you use to add students, log assignments, track attendance, or program your numeric keypad (if your Apple has one) for even speedier data entry.

Amazing Window's solid apple-A (SA-A) command adds assignments — up to 50 per grading period — and, if your assignments don't vary substantially from semester to semester (or year to year), you can save your gradebook as a template or style sheet. Although Amazing Window handles an unlimited number of classes, it tracks a maximum of 50 students in each. This capacity's adequate for most K-12 classes, but the limitation will give you pause if you teach Biology 101, for example, to a lecture hall of 250 university freshmen.

TO THE TEST

I tested the program on an unaccelerated IIGs running in fast and normal modes, and was amazed at the program's operating speed in both cases. Program-loading time was another story, however. It took from one-half to one minute to load the program, depending on the GS system speed I selected and the type of drive I used. (I loaded the program from 5.25- and 3.5-inch drives, but didn't test any hard drives.)

Amazing Window provides many noteworthy features, especially the ability to enter special codes for missed, incomplete, or excused assignments; to post coded grades so that you don't invade a student's right to privacy; to implement as many as nine weighted areas for homework, quizzes, special assignments, and labs (or up to nine elementary-school subjects); and to calculate statistics (mean and standard deviation) automatically along with grades.

I found a few misspellings and at least one apostrophe error in the manual, and another in the UNSAC utility's screen. I'd like to see future editions of the written documentation rise to the same high standard as the software it describes.

At only \$39.95, Amazing Window is unquestionably a good value. And at \$1 per teacher, the program's site-license pricing is downright revolutionary.

Whether or not you already use a computer program to streamline your grade-keeping chores, a good grade from us means you should give Amazing Continued on page 74

THE YISAR IN RIVIEW

Dozens of new Apple II programs for home and school made their débuts this past year — here's a look back at the hits of '91.

t was Oscar night in August at *inCider/A*+ as we screentested scores of recent Apple II packages for this "Year in Review" roundup. Although a few of the finalists described below are significant updates of earlier versions, the vast majority of the 150 or so products listed here and in the accompanying sidebar, "More 1991 Headliners," were brand-new releases this year. Where noted, some products were in development at press time; they should be available this month.

Be aware that although you'll discover dozens of new products described below, one article can't tell the whole story. Among other limitations, we weren't able to contact every Apple II software publisher. Moreover, we haven't included the hundreds of recently released shareware and public-domain programs out there — another rich resource for your growing software library.

Although we've highlighted some new productivity software in the writeups below, our main focus is on education products. For parents and teachers, 1991 was yet another banner year for Apple II software. Keep in mind that in general, educational-software companies let schools take a look at their programs before paying for them. Sunburst's shrink-wrap message is one typical example of this kind of policy: "Please open this package! We want you to preview our program. Opening it places you under no obligation." What a refreshing change from companies that hermetically seal their disks under those penalty-of-death warning labels we're all familiar with.

For those of you who've made the switch, theoretically all Apple II-family products should run on the Macintosh LC with the IIe Emulation Card. We didn't test this feature; if you have questions about compatibility or any other program function, why not call the product's publisher for details? Many Apple II software companies offer toll-free numbers. Publishers can bring you up to date on current availability, as well as pricing for network versions and site or district licenses, as well.

We salute software publishers such as those included in this "Year in Review" who continue to support the Apple II. Let's support them in '92 and beyond.

IT'S A BIRD, IT'S A PLANE ... IT'S

SYSTEM 6

Disguised as mild-mannered System 6, a powerful assortment of utilities and add-ons fight a neverending battle for TrueType, aliases, and the new Macintosh way.

n his patented monotone delivery, the comedian Steven Wright tells a classic joke about returning to his apartment one night only to discover that burglars had broken in and stolen all his worldly possessions, then replaced everything with exact duplicates. This ultimate psych-out got me to thinking: If you could duplicate all the whiz-bang features of System 7 without upgrading from System 6, how would you know that you weren't really running the Mac's newest operating system?

Preparing your Mac to run System 7 can be troublesome. First, you need a hard-disk drive and at least 2 megabytes of memory (4 megabytes is a more realistic minimum). Then you have to upgrade scads of applications, desk accessories (DAs), startup documents (INITs), and Control Panel devices (cdevs). Who needs the hassle?

Ignore all the marketing hype for a moment and the truth becomes self-evident: You can emulate most System 7 features — file sharing, multitasking, color icons, aliases, TrueType, and virtual memory — rather easily and convincingly under System 6. The notable exception is the much-ballyhooed "interapplication communi-

- cation" (IAC), which links documents (created with the same application or different
- programs) so that you can update any copied-
- and-pasted material just once and see it
- reflected in all linked files. But if you can do without this "publish and subscribe" function
 - and most users can there's little reason to
- switch to System 7 just yet.
- How can you fool your Mac into thinking you're using System 7 when you're actually
- sticking with tried-and-true System 6? Read on,
- and we'll show you some System 6 tips you may
- have overlooked, introduce you to some nifty shareware and public-domain utilities, and
- recommend a handful of invaluable commer-




Figure 1. System 6 desktop, with MultiFinder and numerous add-on utilities installed. Note EasyShare folders, POWER-icons aliases, On Location file search, Now Utilties' Customizer font switch, ClickChange modifications, and the user-created pre-Trash folder.




Figure 2. Adobe Type Manager creates screen fonts that are truer to their PostScript print appearance at any size.

cial packages that'll help you get the most from your Mac right now.

ALL AT ONCE

System 7 is a multitasking operating system, which basically means you can run more than one application at the same time. For instance, your telecommunications package can be downloading all your electronic-mail messages while you're writing a memo with your word processor.

System 6 users can accomplish the same thing by running Apple's **MultiFinder** program. After installing it in your System folder, highlight your startup volume, choose *Set Startup* from the Finder's *Special* menu, then click on the *MultiFinder* radio button at the top of the dialog box to enable it. The next time you restart, MultiFinder will be active and you can open as many

applications as you want, memory permitting (**Figure 1**).

If you always start off by opening a particular DA or launching your favorite application, you can use Set Startup to automate the procedure. First, open all files that you want opened upon each startup, choose Set Startup from the Finder's Special menu, then click on the MultiFinder radio button at the top of the dialog box. Finally, click on Opened Applications and DAs. This duplicates the function of System 7's Startup Items folder.

SHARE ALIKE

Macs have always had built-in Apple-Talk-networking capability. But Apple advertisements would have you believe that until System 7 came along, you needed to dedicate a Mac as a

file server if you wanted to exchange files with others on the network. In reality, all you need to trade files under System 6 are two or more Macs connected by AppleTalk cables. If you share a printer currently, you already have all the network you need.

Flash from Beagle Bros is an INIT that lets you send files to other Macs on your AppleTalk network by simply dragging those files to special folders on your hard disk. Conversely, files sent to you appear in special "in box" folders. For the security minded among you, you can require the recipients of your files to provide passwords before the system grants access. In addition to providing file exchange, Flash also offers a bare-bones electronic-mail mode that lets you "chat" with other users in real time—just type notes to one another in the *Chat* window. Incidentally, Flash creates a "paper"

trail of chat sessions automatically. You can use Flash across zones, but you must purchase one copy for each zone. (All members of any one zone can use a single package.)

Like Flash, **EasyShare** from Symmetry lets you exchange files with other users, but instead of creating special folders, it functions as an *AppleShare* file server: Using the EasyShare DA, you specify which volumes or folders to "publish" (make available to other users). If you like, you can assign individual passwords. To access your folders, users select the AppleShare icon in the Chooser, then highlight your "file server." Once they close the Chooser, whatever you published appears as a standard AppleShare file server on their Finder's desktop (**Figure 1**).

allShare from EveryWare also relies on AppleShare. Using this cdev, you can allow access to an entire volume, a single folder, or all folders except one you want to keep private. A password option restricts access to authorized users. If server operations slow down your Mac too much, you can allocate greater priority to your own tasks.

Also available is a utility called **Public Folder**, a file-transfer and -sharing Chooser document offered free to users of Claris products. Just create a special "public" folder on your hard disk and place into it any files and folders you want to make available to other Public Folder users connected to your AppleTalk network. Access is via the Chooser: Users mount the public folder as an AppleShare volume on their desktops. Public Folder provides no security options, but, remember, it's free.

A.K.A. . . .

Under System 7 it's possible for a file to be in more than one folder simultaneously. Click on a file, choose *Make Alias* from the Finder's *File* menu, and you have an alias — a tiny clone file that you can place anywhere you like. The alias acts just like the original; double-click on it to open or launch the original. So if you're not sure whether to place a particular program in your *Applications* folder or your *Utilities* folder, for instance, make an alias and put it in both.

POWERicons from Magic Software is a program that creates aliases under System 6. Just select an application you want to clone, then specify where the alias should be located. (Unlike System 7, which lets you make aliases of any type of file, POWER-

icons works with applications only.) For example, you can place a Microsoft Word alias on the Finder's desktop to eliminate the need to delve into nested folders each time you want to write a letter (Figure 1). You can even attach frequently used documents so that the system opens them automatically when you launch the alias.

POWERicons aliases take up just 5K of disk space each, though they may point to multimegabyte applications. And, like System 7 aliases, POWERicons aliases can point to original applications on another machine on the same network.

For example, you can put aliases of your hard drive's applications on a floppy, pop it into another workstation on the network, and access your applications and related documents as if they actually resided on the floppy.

ON THE TRAIL

Despite its name, the Finder couldn't really find anything until System 7 came along and gave it the ability to track a file by its name, size, type, label, date created, date modified, version, comments, or lock status.

DiskTop from CE Software is a file-maintenance DA that — among many other things — lets System 6 users find files based on name, size, type, date created, and date modified.

DiskTop is better than System 7's Find command in that it can locate files whose attributes match more than one search criterion. For instance, you can search for all filenames containing Read and whose size is less than 20K.

On Location from ON Technology can also hunt down files based on their names, but it's most useful for finding documents based on their contents. For example, it can quickly locate all documents containing the root of the word *search* (Figure 1). Its speed is made possible by maintaining indexes for each volume. The program updates indexes automatically in the background; they usually require no more than 2 percent of the disk space taken up by the volume's files.

TAKE A LOOK

Like System 7's View Control Panel, the Customizer application in the Now Utilities package gives you control over — among other things — the display of icons and text in the Finder under System 6.

Instead of the usual straight rows and columns, you can specify a staggered grid pattern for your icons. Also, you can change the Finder's 9-point Geneva default font (Figure 1).

If this last item interests you, Peter S. Bryant's share-ware cdev called **sysFont** does the same thing for the default Mac system font (12-point Chicago) used in menus, dialog boxes, buttons, and so on.




Figure 3. Virtual captures up to 14 megabytes on your hard drive to simulate RAM.

GETTING A FACELIFT

Along with many new features, System 7 offers a facelift to the Mac's sagging WIMP (windows, icons, mouse, pull-down menus) interface. The Finder can finally display icons in color, and windows are dressed up with 3D shading of elements such as title bars, scroll bars, and close, zoom, and resize boxes.

System 6 users needn't be jealous; with SunDesk, an INIT that displays Finder icons in 8-bit color (up to 256 different hues), you can gussy up your interfaces, too. It comes with dozens of color icons for common applications and other Finder elements, such as the *System* folder and the *Trash* (Figure 1). Using the *ResEdit* option, creating more color icons is easy. SunDesk is copyrighted, but it's free. Additional icons are available free through user groups and on-line services, or you can purchase them from Immedium Design.




Figure 1. Rotary-type cards produced with the sample records in the ROTARY database.

ClickChange is a cdev from Dubl-Click Software; its six modules let you customize almost every aspect of the Mac's look and feel. ClickChange lets you alter standard interface elements: cursors, windows, buttons, colors, and sounds. The Window, Scroll, and Button modules let you modify screen elements to look as they do under System 7, as well as NeXT, IBM, and Sun platforms (Figure 1). Additional modules let you link sound effects to Mac events, change the colors of screen objects, and replace the standard cursors with animated substitutes.

TRASH IT

Under System 7, items you place in the Trash aren't deleted whenever you choose *Restart* or *Shut Down* from the Finder's *Special* menu; launch an application; copy a file; or drag the disk's icon to the Trash.

Instead, tossed items remain in the dustbin until you specifically choose *Empty Trash* from the Finder's *Special* menu.

Simulating this arrangement under System 6 is easy enough. To prevent the Finder from deleting a file before you really want to, create a new folder named *B4Trash*, or whatever you like. Place it on the desktop next to the real *Trash* icon, but instead of dragging files to the *Trash*, toss them in this folder (**Figure 1**). When you're positive you no longer need any of the files in the *B4Trash* folder, drag its contents to the real *Trash* and choose *Empty Trash* from the *Special* menu.

HANDY DEVICES

System 7 makes great strides toward improving consistency in the way the Mac operates. Instead of selecting via a centralized Control Panel DA, you can now double-click on individual cdevs just like applications.

With Steve Bollinger's **GooPanel** you can add this capability to System 6 (**Figure 1**). This freeware application works in conjunction with an INIT to turn individual cdevs into double-clickable "applications."

TYPESET QUALITY

TrueType is Apple's new outline-font technology, providing smooth type at virtually any size — both on screen and in printouts — using a single font file. With True-Type, the stair-stepping jaggies are a thing of the past, as are those vast collections of bit-mapped (screen) fonts in myriad sizes necessary for good-looking output.

Originally slated for introduction as part and parcel of System 7, **TrueType** was actually released earlier as an INIT for System 6.0.7 and is available free from any Apple dealer. Unfortunately, to take advantage of TrueType, you must either purchase TrueType fonts or convert your existing PostScript fonts with a utility such as Ares Software's FontMonger or Metamorphosis Professional from Altsys.

If you opt for Adobe Type Manager instead of Apple's TrueType INIT, there's no need to convert PostScript fonts you already own. ATM incorporates Adobe's PostScript language outline-font software, eliminating jagged characters so that your screen can display high-quality typefaces of any size or style (Figure 2). ATM also enables inexpensive QuickDraw printers to print PostScript fonts (but not graphics), and when used in conjunction with fax modems, it produces the best-looking fax printouts ever seen.

A LONG MEMORY

As applications become increasingly complex, so too do their memory demands grow. To address this problem, System 7 has built-in virtual-memory capability. When engaged, the Mac uses excess space on your hard disk to simulate RAM (random-access memory), swapping data and program code between actual and virtual memory as needed for working with large documents and multiple applications.

You don't need System 7 to take advantage of virtual memory. All you need is a Mac equipped with a Motorola MC68851 PMMU (paged memory-management unit) chip and a copy of Connectix's Virtual. With Virtual, you can have up to 14 megabytes at your disposal (Figure 3). True, virtual memory is considerably slower than real memory, but it's a cost-efficient way of satisfying the demands of memory-hungry applications.

LAUNCH MENU

One of the most convenient touches of System 7 is that you can place just about anything — applications, documents, folders, Control Panels, and aliases — on the *Apple* menu, not just DAs. To install an item on the *Apple* menu, you simply copy it into the *Apple Menu Items* folder within the *System* folder. Kiss Font/DA Mover goodbye!

While nothing can compare to the simplicity of dragging files into a folder, System 6 users have several alternatives. **On Cue** from ICOM Simulations is one of the oldest file-launching utilities. It places a special menu on either corner of the Finder's menu

bar, from which you can launch applications or related documents, regardless of where the files actually reside on your hard drive.


In addition to launching files like On Cue, Hand-Off II from Connectix also lets you assign sound level and color depth to individual applications, then adjusts those features automatically whenever you launch a program (Figure 1). That's nice, but the utility earned its name because it eliminates that annoying Application Not Found dialog box that appears whenever you double-click on a document and the Finder can't locate the application that created it. Instead, Hand-Off launches a substitute application of your choice that can open the desired document.

Don't get me wrong — I think System 7's swell. But do you really want to live with

the uncertainty that accompanies any software release whose version number ends in zero? You can have the best of both worlds — stick with System 6 and add System 7-style innovations, too. Whether you're talking cosmetics or file organization, tried-and-true doesn't have to mean old-and-worn-out, thanks to a wide assortment of utilities and add-ons that can streamline your Mac's operation. System 7's got great potential, but for now — at least until Apple works out the bugs — I'd rather fight than switch. \square



APPLEWORKS IN ACTION

PICK A CARD

Stay happy this holiday season with phone-and-address rotary index cards printed from an AppleWorks database.

IT'S HOLIDAY-CARD TIME, SEASONAL soirée time. Do you know where your family and friends' phone numbers and addresses are? Well, maybe yes and maybe no. You may keep them in spanking good order all year round, ready for all occasions. Then again, maybe all you have is scribbled bits of paper that would take a decoder ring to figure out.

This month's database can help. It's a place to store names, addresses, phone numbers, and notes that you can then print on rotary index (a.k.a. Rolodex) cards. The best part is that you can update the information quickly and print new cards instantly.

In developing this database, I used pin-fed 4-by-2-and-one-sixth-inch rotary cards in 100-pound card stock — sturdy enough to withstand frazzled fingers. (See Figure 1.) It doesn't matter if you don't have card stock now. Regular printer paper can give you a good idea what the cards will look like.

A DATABASE FROM SCRATCH

Create a new AppleWorks database file named **ROTARY**. The *Review/Add/Change* screen appears with the cursor on *Category 1*.

The accompanying **Table** shows all the categories — 15 active and six spares that you can use later for additional information. Separating first and last names as well as cities, states, and zip codes gives you full flexibility in sorting records.

The number of items on rotary cards

varies. Some cards — such as ones for a book shop or an airline — may show only a company name and phone number. Others — say, for a business or a computer group — may be filled with names, addresses, phone numbers, comments, and the like. To accommodate this variability, I gave two categories double duty — Last Name/Company and Title/Contact.

The Last Name/Company category, which is filled in every record, can hold either an individual's last name or a company

name. When you enter a last name, you enter the person's title, if any, in the *Title/Contact* category. When you add a company name, you enter the contact's name in the *Title/Contact* category and leave the *Company* category empty. All of this will make more sense when you fill the records.

Now press Open apple-Y (OA-Y) to erase Category 1. Referring to the accompanying **Table**, enter the category names and press Return after each one. The first 15 categories will appear in the left column, the other six (all spares) will show up in the right.

When you finish, press OA-S to store the database on disk. AppleWorks announces that you're entering *Insert New Records* mode, which is what you want, so press Return or the space bar and an empty *Record 1* appears, awaiting your entries.

FILL 'ER UP

Before starting to fill records, it's always wise to scan for common entries. You can have AppleWorks type these common entries, called *standard values*, automatically, saving you the trouble. *Record 1* contains the following entries (all other categories are empty):

Last Name/Company ACE FLORIST
Title/Contact JULIE OR SAM
Street BROADWAY MOON MALL
City ABNER
State NY
Work 516-555-5566
Update 8-23-90




Figure 2. Records in the ROTARY database.

Figure 2 shows entries in the other records. One entry — NY in the State field — appears in almost every record, so make it a standard value: Press OA-V to bring up the Set Standard Values screen. Press Return seven times to move the cursor to the State category, type NY, press Return

again, and hit Escape to go back to the Insert New Records screen.

The State category now contains NY. Every time you start a new record, AppleWorks inserts this entry into that category. (When a standard entry outlives its usefulness, you can delete it from the Set Standard Values screen. This deletion affects future records only, not existing ones.)

Move the cursor up to the Last Name/Company category, then, referring to the entries mentioned earlier, fill Record 1: Type an entry, then press Return as many times as necessary to move to the next category needing an entry, type that one, and so on (skipping the State entry, of course). After you fill the update section, pause a moment and press Return.

Update contains the word date, so when you press Return or the spacebar, Apple-Works converts what you type — 8-23-90 — to a three-character month, two-digit day, and two-digit year. Now press OA-Down Arrow to move to the Last Name/Company category in Record 2.

Referring to Figure 2, fill the other records in the same way. In Records 4, 6, and 7 through 10, be sure to type the comma after the last name. It separates the last name from the first on the rotary card. In Records 6, 7, and 10, overtype NY with the proper state characters. (Press OA-E to toggle to the overtype cursor.) After you type the date in the Update section in Record 10 and press Return, press OA-S to store the database on disk.

GOOD TO LOOK AT

AppleWorks now brings up the multiplerecord layout screen. Press OA-< to bring the first few categories into view. To accommodate entries of varying lengths as much as possible and to fit another category on screen, change the column widths: Press OA-L to bring up the Change Record Layout screen.

The cursor is in the Last Name/Company column, which, like all columns here, is 15 characters wide. Press OA-Right Arrow four times to widen it to 19 characters. Press Tab to move to the First column. Press OA-Left Arrow five times to reduce it to ten characters. In the same way, adjust the other column widths as follows:

MI	-13	Home -2
Title/Contact	-1	Work -2
Company	-4	Note1 +3
Street	+4	Note2 +3
City	-2	Note3 +3
State	-10	Update -5
Zip	-9	

Now hit Escape. You want the cursor to move to the right when you change a record in *multiple-record layout*, so type 2 and hit Return. The last few categories appear in the Review/Add/Change screen.

It's easier to keep track of records in alphabetical order: Press OA-< three times to reach the Last Name/Company category, and press OA-A to start the Arrange command. Confirm Category (Last Name/Company), then From A to Z. The Review/Add/Change screen returns with all records in alphabetical order.

REPORT: ROTARY CARDS

Now create the rotary-card report format: Press OA-P to bring up the Report menu, type 3 to select Create a new "labels" format, and hit Return twice, the second time to confirm From scratch. Type ROTARY CARD, the name of this report, and hit Return. AppleWorks brings up a screen containing all the category names. Your goal is to make this screen look like the one in Figure 3.

First, get rid of the unnecessary spare categories: Hold down Right Arrow until

the cursor reaches the S in Spare1. Press OA-D, then Down Arrow, OA-D again, then Down Arrow again. Continue in this way to delete all six spares.

Next, combine the first three categories. Press Return, then Up Arrow five times to reach the F in First. Press OA-Right Arrow five times and OA-Up Arrow once to put First one character behind Last. Press OA-J. The less-than sign (<) tells Apple-Works to left-justify the First category entry, regardless of the length of the Last category entry, thus preventing gaps between them, or truncated entries.

Press Return twice to move to the *MI* (middle initial) category. Press OA-Right Arrow 12 times and OA-Up Arrow twice to move *MI* behind *First*. Again, press OA-J. Hit Return, then OA-D twice to delete both blank lines.

Next, combine the City, State, and Zip categories: Move the cursor to the S in State, press OA-Right Arrow five times and OA-Up Arrow once, then press OA-J to left-justify. Move to the Z in Zip, press OA-Right Arrow 12 times, then OA-Up Arrow twice. Press OA-J.

Hit Return three times to move to *Home*. Now press OA-Right Arrow 25 times, then OA-Up Arrow seven times to place it in the second column. Printing the category name before the entry helps distinguish a home phone from a work phone, so press OA-V to turn on this feature for this category. AppleWorks nows displays a colon after *Home*. In the same way, move *Work* to

its place below *Home*, then press OA-V. This time Apple-Works shows a colon and a phone number after the category. The phone number is the entry in the work category in the first record.

Referring to Figure 3, shift all other categories into place, pressing OA-V only after *Update*. When you finish, your screen should look just like the one in Figure 3.

Now press OA-O to bring up the *Printer Options* screen. First, change the paperlength setting: Type **PL** and hit Return. Each record is a complete page. The paperlength equivalent of a 2-and-one-sixth-inch rotary card at six lines to the inch is 2.1 inches, so type 2.1 and hit Return.

To fit more characters on a line, print them smaller: Type CI, press Return, type 12, and hit Return again. A header on each page is a hindrance, so type PH and hit Return once more to turn off the header.

Now press OA-S to save the database, and return to the multiple-record layout screen.

PRINT THE RECORDS

If you have rotary-card stock, this is a good time to load it. (Otherwise use regular printer paper, then hold the printout over a strip of cards to check the fit.) Typically, the top of the print shield on your printer should be flush with the top of the first card. Printers vary, however, and a fraction of an inch up or down may improve positioning.

HARDCOPY RESULTS

Now turn on your printer so that you can print the records. Press OA-P and hit the return key twice to confirm Get a report format and ROTARY CARD. Press OA-P again to bring up the Print the Report screen, hit the return key again to confirm the printer (or type a printer number, then hit the return key), and

confirm one copy. The printer whirs, producing a batch of records in rotary-card layout.

If something's amiss after you print the records — for instance, you end up with only one record on a page — chances are you need to change the AppleWorks top-of-page setting from Yes to No.

To change this setting, go back to the main menu and select Other Activities, then choose Select standard settings for AppleWorks and Specify information about your printer(s). Then select the number under Change printer specifications that corresponds to your model.

In the Change a Printer screen, type 2

for Accepts top-of-page command, hit Return, and type Y to change the value to No. Be sure that the third item, Stop at end of each page, is also set to No.

Print the records the same way as before. If changing the top-of-page setting doesn't solve the problem, refer to your printer manual.

NEW RECORDS ONLY

When you create a new record or update an existing one, you want to be able to print a card for that record only, not every record in the database.

Imagine that you've just updated the Karen Thompson record and now want to print it. You're still in the Report Format screen. Press OA-R to start the recordselection process. Apple-Works brings up the Select Records screen containing all 21 categories. Hit Return twice to confirm Last Name/Company and equals. Type THOMPSON, (don't forget the comma) as the comparison information, and hit Return.

You could have another Thompson record, so zero in on Karen's by confirming and. Now type 2 to select First and hit Return twice. Type

printer paper, then hold the Figure 3. Report format for printing rotary cards.

KAREN and hit Return again. That does it, so hit Escape. You can see the recordselection criteria in the upper-left corner of the screen.

To print the selected record, make sure your printer is on, press OA-P, select the printer, and confirm one copy. And there's the Karen Thompson record. Piece of cake! To return record selection to all records, press OA-R and type Y.

This ends the hands-on session. What follows are ideas to use when working with this database.

CHANGING A SPARE

Let's suppose you want to activate a spare to hold directions on how to get to an individual or company, for instance. Press OA-N to bring up the Change Name/Category screen. Hold down the down-arrow key until the cursor rests on Spare 1. Press OA-E to switch to the overtype cursor (a flashing rectangle). Type Get There and hit Return. You now have a place in your database for route numbers, cross streets, and the like. If one line isn't enough, convert other spares to hold more.

CROSS-REFERENCING

Even though you arrange cards in alphabetical order, you may not always remember the name of the company or person under which a card is filed. You may want to call Dorothy, your travel agent, for example, but you don't remember her last name or the name of the travel agency. That's a good reason for having several cards — it gives you more than one shot at finding a record quickly.

You don't have to retype an entire record to cross-reference. All you do is copy an existing record and change the necessary entries. Let's use the Fairytale Travel record as an example. Without going into all the details, first use OA-C to make two copies of the record. In the first copy, enter OZ in the Last Name/ Company category, then DOROTHY in the First category, and FAIRYTALE TRAVEL in the Company category. Using OA-Y, delete DOROTHY OZ in the Title/Contact category.

In the second copy, enter TRAVEL AGENT in the Last Name/Company category and FAIRYTALE TRAVEL in the Company category. Now when wanderlust strikes, you're sure to find Dorothy and her travel agency at the flip of a card.

MADE IN THE SHADE

Want to know how to make your pictures really shine? Brush up on the basics of light and shadow.

SO YOU THINK YOU'VE GOT THAT painting program right where you want it — you've read the documentation at least three times, experimented with all its important tools, and created a diskful of work. But something's just not right. Although you've got the implementation down, your artwork still looks humdrum. The cure? Well, put away that manual for a while. It's time to brush up on some fundamental art principles, starting with form, light, and shade. No matter the medium in which you're creating, the same basic rules apply.

IN THE BEGINNING

Just because your canvas here is a computer, you can't forget to give your pictures dimension. Learning to use light and shade — the shadow patterns you see on objects, which change with direction

of light and the shape of each object — in your creations is integral to making two-dimensional renditions look three-dimensional. The first thing you need, naturally, is light. You need to locate the light source in your picture, even though it may not be within the frame of the picture itself.

Try setting up a few simple still lifes in the corner of a room, then try lighting them in a variety of ways. See how the shadows move as you shift the light, and how this changes the character and feel of the arrangement? Lighting can make the difference in the mood of a picture, and depending on the subject you've chosen, can make the picture look more dramatic.

Setting up an actual still life next to your computer each time you create a picture isn't really practical (or necessary), but becoming familiar with the character of different lighting effects is an important lesson. With this understanding you can apply your knowledge to any subject — real or imaginary.




Figure 1. Note the way light at an angle casts shadow patterns on these objects in the same direction.

If you're a beginning artist, you'll have best results if you stick with only one strong light source (real or figurative), coming from the left or right side, from below or above, or from almost any angle except from the direction of the viewer. (See Figure 1.) Frontal lighting destroys the illusion of form, because it washes out all shadow patterns on the object — it casts all shadows behind it. Even experienced artists generally avoid frontal lighting, unless they're trying to create a specific effect.

And once you establish the location of your picture's light source, stay true to it. A common mistake is to cast shadows in all directions by lighting some objects from one side and others from another side. Each object may look its best with different lighting, but the picture as a whole doesn't hang together. The result is a confusing and unconvincing illusion of reality.




Figure 2. Note the shadow pattern on the object itself — light to dark to reflected light — as well as the cast shadow behind it.

Note the characteristics of the light on each object in **Figure 1** and on the apple in **Figure 2**. The light enters from the left of all objects and casts shadows to the right. When you have a single light source, you can generally follow the rule that light travels from light, to dark, to reflected light (never as light as the front, but a





lighter area within the shadow pattern on the object), to cast shadow as it moves across and away from an opaque object.

That may sound simple (and it is, really), but it's surprising to see the number of people who render an object in light and shade, then omit the cast shadow that places it firmly in its environment. Many other aspiring artists perhaps remember the cast shadow, but draw an unconvincingly flat shadow pattern on the object itself.

Now let's look again at the lighting effects in still lifes, this time in more detail. Note the subtle variation of tone within an object's shadow: After the shadow has reached its darkest dark, it subtly grows lighter again at the point farthest from the light. This variation in shading, which you should incorporate into your pictures, is a result of reflected light from other objects nearby, or from a nearby wall, or in the case of objects outdoors, from the sky itself, reflecting the original light source back from the opposite direction.

The darkest dark in your picture should be in the cast shadow, closest to the point where the shadow trails away from the object. After all, the object itself blocks even reflected light from creeping into that area. As the cast shadow moves away from the object it should gradually become lighter and the edges softer as more and more ambient light gets into it.

WORKING THE EDGES

Paying close attention to a shadow pattern's edges (shading on the object itself) is particularly important if you want to create a convincing illusion of form. The larger and rounder the form, the softer its edge should be.

If you were to shine light on the side of a small white cylinder (about the size of a cigarette), for example, then enlarge the same cylinder to about the size of a telephone pole and put it in the same light, the larger cylinder would have a broad, very soft edge as it went from light to dark, while the smaller cylinder would have a narrow, almost sharp edge in contrast. Also, the "faster" an edge turns, the sharper it should appear in shading. A cylinder's shadow pattern, for example, has a softer rounded edge, but the edge of a box's shadow pattern is quite sharp.

Cast shadows can help you define the

edges and the form of your original object. If you draw a straight-on view of a object with a light source shining on its side, for example, its shadow will reveal the shape of its body. (See **Figure 1**.)

PLUGGING IT INTO THE SYSTEM

With these lessons in mind, let's focus on your chosen medium — the computer. This electronic easel provides a few interesting tools that should help you apply some of these principles.

Gradient-fill mode, which most programs offer, will go a long way toward creating a convincingly shaded object. I use it only in a limited way, though, because too often the results look mechanically perfect. This mode also has difficulty with irregularly shaped objects. In fact, sometimes it can create more work than it saves.

You'll have better luck if you use your program's blend control. (It may have a different name, depending on your program.) Most programs for the Apple IIGS have a paint mode for shading or blending that's perfect for a technique that resembles charcoal drawing. (In fact, in Platinum Paint it's aptly called charcoal mode.)

As we discussed last time in "Palette Primer" (October 1991, p. 56), using this mode requires some careful preparatory work as you set up the palette. You must first create a range of greys (or whatever color you want to work in) that go in an unbroken row from light to dark (or vice versa). The more shades in the range, the better for this technique. A monochromatic palette of 16 shades of the same color is best. (See your manual for set-up instructions.) For those of you using a Macintosh, setting up the palette may be simpler, and the mode for painting is more likely transparency.

Then you might begin by roughing out your initial drawing, blocking in the basic shapes and composition. When you're satisfied, it's easiest to fill the shape with a middle value from your range, or if you want to finesse it a little, fill the shape with a middle tone relative to the object's overall value. If it's a dark object, such as an apple, fill it with a dark value. If it's a lighter-toned object, such as an orange, make it a light tone. With that done, you can start on the fun stuff.

Again, working with your program's shade mode is much like using a soft char-

coal: If you want an area darker, apply a little more charcoal. If you want it lighter, just rub some of it away. Each spot you rub with the brush (in an area that's filled with part of the range) will shift to a darker part of the range, regardless of the number of values under the brush. To make an area lighter, simply hold down the option key and rub again.

You can vary your strokes, and by changing the size and shape of your brush, you can alter the effects you achieve. Experiment with this method and you'll produce endless variations — and from there you can determine your preferences.

Another handy aspect of your paint program's shade mode is that if you leave one color at one end of the palette out of the range, you can use it as a background color. Then, when you work in shade mode, your brush strokes won't affect this background color. You can "go outside the lines" without changing the background.

Sometimes I like to vary the method described above by filling the entire screen with a middle tone from the range (rather than filling objects), then using the brush to pull out lights and darks — it makes a picture emerge from the background. This technique will give you an even tone overall, unifying the entire picture.

When you use your program's shade/charcoal mode and the techniques described here you'll achieve a great amount of control and subtlety of value. It's ideal for applying the principles of light and shadow discussed above, and it's perfect for working with soft edges.

Whatever method you use, or whatever you come up with in your own exploration, if you're careful to keep a strong sense of light and shade, and make sure that the subjects of your pictures "live" in the same light source, your artwork should take on a new feeling of realism and dimension.

Mug o' Cheer

"Eat, drink, and be merry" with a desktop-publishing project for the holidays.

STOP RACKING YOUR BRAIN FOR that perfect gift — turn to your Apple II or Macintosh instead. You probably don't realize it, but you've got the know-how to create custom-designed decorative plastic mugs. Not only are these items great for Christmas gifts, but they can help you celebrate special events throughout the year.

Although you probably own the software you need for this project (virtually any Apple II or Mac graphics program will work), you'll have to purchase the main ingredient — the mugs. Each mug you

design consists of two pieces of plastic that fit together to produce an outer transparent layer and an inner white liner. Between these two pieces you place your personalized design or message.

MUGS ABOUND

We first discovered these nifty mugs, called Make It Yourself Mugs, in Richman Cotton Company's mail-order catalog. (See "Product Information" for details.) Kelly's Crafts, a company also listed in the Product Information box, sells them as Kelly's Fun Mugs. You may also find them in your local department store. Ames, the New England-based discount

store, carries the line in its crafts section.

Whatever supplier you choose, the basic procedure is the same. Simply rub some glue from a glue stick onto the back of one edge of a 3.5-by-10-inch computer-printed design, then insert it into the see-through part of the mug. Spread the design so that it fits snugly against the inside wall. Match the design's edges carefully and press the seam so that it makes good contact with the glue. Insert the white plastic mug liner and press together the two mug parts. That's all there is to it.

According to the products' accompanying literature, you can take the mugs apart a half-dozen times before they lose their water resistance. (Disassembling the mug means you can change the design you created.) Hand washing is recommended to extend each mug's life.


ANYTHING GOES

Computerized mug designs, such as those shown in Figure 1, can consist of anything you like, as long as your artwork fits on a piece of paper that's no more than 10 inches wide and 3.5 inches high. Almost any Apple II or Macintosh graphics program can fill the bill, but a workaround's necessary with some Apple II products. Let's begin by taking an overview of the mug-design process. Later on we'll provide pointers for creating mugs with The Print Shop IIGS, The Print Shop for the Macintosh, and Publish It! 4.

In general, genuine Apple IIGs programs such as **Platinum Paint** or **AppleWorks GS** — and practically all Macintosh programs — support *landscape* printing mode. Before you begin working on a design, usually all you need to do is pull down the *File* menu, select *Page Setup*, and click on the *landscape* orientation icon. Your design will then print sideways. On a standard 8.5-by-11-inch piece of paper, a 3.5-by-10-inch mug

template fits fine when printed sideways. (In the interest of saving the environment — or perfecting the art of good old Yankee frugality — use any scrap paper for handwritten notes.)

If you're using an object-oriented pagelayout or drawing program such as Publish It! 4 or MacDraw II, screen rulers can serve as guides to help keep text frames and graphics images within the boundaries you set for the mug template itself. Depending on your software, you can visualize the outside dimensions of the template by using an appropriate grid, placing custom guides, or rubberbanding a bordered text frame or rectangle. (To rubber-band, hold down the mouse button, drag the mouse diagonally, and release the button when the rectangle looks correct.) This last option is especially efficient, because you can use the border as a cutting guide.

USING YOUR PAINT PROGRAM

Creating a mug design with a paint program is only a little more challenging. Most paint programs display x and y coordinates, but because these data provide only a general idea of an object's dimensions, trial and error may be needed to fine-tune a layout that requires some degree of precision.

To their credit, though, bit-mapped graphics programs frequently offer unparalleled design options such as *flip*, rotate, smear, and blend. Paint programs usually let you import a wide variety of graphics formats, too. With an Apple II graphics-conversion utility such as **SuperConvert** for the IIGs you can even use clip art designed originally on "foreign"

computers such as the Commodore Amiga.

Although Apple II users can also choose from a variety of object-oriented and bit-mapped graphics programs, the software rarely supports sideways printing. Don't worry, though. Although the procedure requires a smidgen more time and attention, you can split your mug template into two halves, design each part, and use a glue stick to unite the sections before assembling the mug. If the graphics program you use doesn't support sideways printing, the tips we provide below for creating a template with Publish It! 4 will help. Just adapt our method as you see fit.

THE PRINT SHOP IIGS

One Apple II program that "knows" how to print sideways is The Print Shop IIGS, at least when it's churning out banners. Moreover, the program's *Print Options* dialog box lets you reduce a banner to a custom size. Through experimentation, we discovered that size reduction to 33 percent works great. The resulting minibanner (which is what a mug design is, after all) is about 3.5 inches high.

Be careful to make your horizontal "banner" no longer than 10 inches, though. Otherwise, part of the design won't show when you assemble the mug. For best results, select one of the program's narrower fonts, such as *Sutter*, and keep the message brief. In general, you should be able to fit about 11 characters if you use a single left-justified or right-justified graphics image on the mug. Single- or multicolored Print Shop GS borders seem to have no effect on the amount of space available for text.

Keeping messages brief may seem like a challenge at first, but gather the family together for a Christmas buzzword brainstorming session. Or you could hum some holiday tunes and select appropriate words from the lyrics. Falalalala, Ho-ho-ho, Gloria!, and Noel come to mind. Of course, personalizing mugs with recipients' first names or nicknames would be a cinch.

If you want to forgo a message and simply use graphics images for your mug design, you should be able to fit three or four Print Shop GS graphics on each one. We created a colorful design using the *Toot* graphics image provided on the **Print Shop Graphics Library Special Edition** disk that came with our version of The Print Shop IIGS. We were able to fit three of the multicolored trumpets across our minibanner.

MAC PRINT SHOP

Creating designer mugs on the Macintosh is as easy as starting up The Print Shop, double-clicking on the Banner illustration, and choosing a graphics image and font. Limited space means you'll want to keep your design relatively simple — such as the one shown in Figure 2.

For this sample we chose the San Francisco font. Before printing on an Image-Writer II, pull down the File menu and choose Select Colors to enhance graphics and text. Pull down the File menu again and click on the Top Half radio button in the Banner Print Options dialog box.

PUBLISH IT! 4

Programs such as Publish It! 4 don't support sideways printing, but it's easy to

get around the restriction: Just split the design into two parts. Rubber-band a text frame that's 5.500 inches wide and 3.500 inches high anywhere on the page. Work in Size to Fit mode by pressing Open apple-4 (OA-4). Press OA-C to copy, then OA-V to paste and create a "twin" text frame. Drag the second frame so that it doesn't overlap the first.

With the pointer tool, double-click on the first frame (or click on it and press OA-M) to open its Specifications dialog box. Click on the Frame Border check box. Do the same for the second text frame.

Overlay these text frames with smaller frames that will hold the text of your message. Select the font you want to use. We chose 72-point Wilmette and put the text in boldface by selecting it with the I-beam, then pressing OA-B. We wanted the Season's Greeting message printed in color, so we selected the text, pulled down the Font menu, chose Color, and clicked on Red.

We imported an old-fashioned sleigh scene from Disk #1011.1A, one in the series of clip-art disks created by Mollie Ann Matlaf with Vitesse's Quickie handheld scanner. Each Out of This World graphics disk provides a self-running slide show for viewing scanned images. Matlaf says that in addition to Publish It!, you can use her clip art with Tutor-Tech. 816/Paint, and Dazzle Draw.

After pressing OA-K to preview the

design, and generating a couple of draft copies, we printed the final version in double-strike mode. (See Figure 3.) Cut out each panel just inside its printed boundary, then use a glue stick to attach the two sections in correct sequence. Proceed in the manner described earlier when it's time for you to assemble the finished mug.

MERRY MUGS

You can have fun experimenting with noncomputerized design elements, too. Consider incorporating some personal photographs or copyright-free clip art from books. You could also try creating collages made from computer-generated text and original artwork - or hand-done calligraphy and electronic art.

Try different kinds of paper in various textures or colors. Cut holiday gift wrap to 8.5-by-11-inch size and print computer-generated text on it - the artwork provides a ready-made background for your holiday greetings. Another quick and painless mugmaking product is Banner Band, the seamless computer paper that comes in rolls and sports preprinted designs.

Short-run "publications" such as mugs look great printed in color on the ImageWriter II, particularly if you use a fresh four-color ribbon. But you can add color easily without a color printer. Just enter the text of your message in a large

font and use the outline style. Then color the letters with markers, pencils, or crayons. Silver or gold glitter adds a festive touch, too.

OPTIONS GALORE

Mugs are endearing, yet inexpensive, gifts. You can fill them with candy, nuts, diminutive soaps in various shapes, or school supplies such as pens and pencils. The possibilities are endless. Personalized mugs make wonderful birthday-party or baby-shower favors. And have you thought about sponsoring a fund-raising mug-athon at your school? Or how about using mugs to promote your business?

Whatever "excuse" you find to have fun making mugs with your Apple II or Macintosh, your creations are sure to be appreciated. Despite petroleum-based origins, plastic mugs can even be good for the environment if they encourage recipients to abandon those made from polystyrene foam.

So sit down at your Apple, fire up your favorite program, and get ready for a very Merry Christmas. See you all next vear!



A record-keeping system saves student-activity scores to disk, letting parents or teachers track individual performance. You can view records on disk or print them for reference.

Kids who achieve perfect scores in any math activity can print a text scoreboard or graphics certificate acknowledging their success. A program editor lets you, the parent or teacher, create customized problem sets for on-screen drills or printed worksheets. You can also use the editor to generate hardcopies of any New Math Blaster Plus data file in test format. Test makers decide whether the problems display in random or sequential order.

A point-and-shoot user interface with pull-down menus and click-on icons makes the program easy to use. Several menu items feature command-key alternatives for selection by keystroke instead of the mouse. Unfortunately, there are no keystroke alternatives for items in the *Subject* and *Level* menus.

TOUGH CHOICES

New Math Blaster Plus consists of four activities. Each one builds on skills learned previously, but youngsters can proceed in any order. Kids begin with Rocket Launcher to review math facts. This exercise features two performance modes: Study lets players see a completed equation before they try to solve it; Solve requires kids to work out the solution without any hints.

In either mode, correct answers direct the program to assemble a strange-looking rocket on a launching pad on the left side of the screen. After the rocket is completed, a Blasternaut boards the ship and blasts off into outer space. Youngsters have the option of proceeding to the next level for a more difficult round of *Rocket Launcher*, or returning to the main-menu screen to choose a different activity.

In Trash Zapper, youngsters must find the missing number in an equation. After five correct answers, the screen changes to an arcade-like trash-zapping game. Challengers must blast floating pieces of trash out of the sky as litter crosses the screen, and earn points for each piece of trash they zap. It takes only a few rounds of trash zapping before addiction sets in; don't be surprised if your child practices solving equations for hours just for a chance to play.

Number Recycler challenges players to make decisions based on number combinations. It features a recycling machine with columns of numbers, operators, and equal signs. Youngsters must analyze an equation to determine whether it's correct. If the equation isn't correct, players enlist the assistance of a Blasternaut who pushes numbers and symbols from the columns into the equation window.

The object of Number Recycler is to come up with the right equation while making the fewest possible moves. Like the math exercises in Rocket Launcher and Trash Zapper, Number Recycler doesn't penalize players for taking time to think. There are no clocks to beat - just lots of numbers to analyze. Youngsters solve problems at their own speed, and create strategies to come up with an equation that sends the fewest numbers into the Zap Chamber. Its ability to teach kids to analyze problems and plan strategies makes this a terrific game. If it only had a save option, which would enable challengers to quit in midplay and resume later at the same spot, it'd be even better.

The final activity is Math Blaster, the game for which the product is named. Elementary-school children have been playing one version or another of this activity for almost ten years — the original Apple II Math Blaster appeared in 1983.

Computer sound, animated graphics, and programming sophistication have come a long way since those pioneering days. The basic game action, however, remains the same, pitting the player against hurtling debris and an encroaching space alien.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

New Math Blaster Plus uses classic drilland-practice techniques to teach kids basic math facts in a stimulating way. Like its predecessors (Math Blaster and Math Blaster Plus), the software motivates youngsters to master the subject matter for higher scores in action-packed arcade games. Kids don't mind working hard to learn math facts because they receive a lot of audiovisual reinforcement.

Yet New Math Blaster Plus is better than its predecessors. It sports a more sophisticated audiovisual repertoire. Its *Trash Recycler* activity offers more than straight drill. This game encourages critical-thinking skills, because kids must devise problem-solving strategies to do well.

All New Math Blaster Plus activities make math fun. Whether you intend to use this software for math review or to supplement classroom instruction, kids will think it's a blast.

Giant warships, intergalactic space travel, space pirates, and rebel commanders — these are the elements of Saturday-morning cartoons, a cinematic Hollywood extravaganza from LucasFilm, or an exciting *Star Trek* episode. They're hardly the stuff you'd expect to find on CD-ROM for the Macintosh II.

Yet, thanks to the pioneering computerentertainment efforts of a company called Reactor, Inc. (and its principal programmers, Mike Saenz and Joe Sparks), Spaceship Warlock is now appearing in glorious color on a CD-ROM-equipped Macintosh II near you.

COSMIC OSMO: THE NEXT GENERATION

In many ways, Reactor's Spaceship Warlock resembles Activision's pioneering Cosmic Osmo. Both products invite you to experience the electronic thrills and chills of fantasy space exploration. Both sport an intuitive point-and-click interface with invisible navigational buttons (regions) that permit you to explore and advance your quest. Both offer exciting (but unpredictable) audiovisual reinforcement when you use the mouse to select items on screen.

The similarities stop there, though. Cosmic Osmo is low-tech by comparison. Its two-dimensional black-and-white graphics images pale in comparison to Spaceship Warlock's rich visual artistry. If you like Cosmic Osmo, you'll be amazed by Spaceship Warlock.

Spaceship Warlock takes place in a world dominated by the evil Kroll Imperium — no place for the preschool crowd. This futuristic 8-bit animated wonder spotlights a band of renegade space pirates, led by Hammer, a toughtalking but brilliant rebel commander who makes the Terminator look like a Sesame Street character. Hammer's ultimate objective is to overthrow the Imperium and restore the great Terran Empire.

Unfortunately, the Kroll have removed the planet Terra from its orbit and hidden it deep in uncharted space. Whether or not the rebel forces are successful depends on your persistence, your ingenuity, and your control of this fascinating simulation.

THE GAME'S AFOOT

Play begins in the dark alleyways of Stambul City, a seedy concrete jungle that's meaner and more unforgiving than any 20th-century urban metropolis. Stambul monitors, used by the Kroll for propaganda and control, are everywhere. This two-way technology is vaguely reminiscent of Big Brother's watchful eye in George Orwell's 1984. You must explore the environment in an effort to gain a sense of your mission.

Violence and barroom language (complete with colorful four-letter words) abound. Spaceships and flying cars zoom by overhead. An alien belly dancer struts her stuff in a downtown bar reminiscent of the rough-and-tumble intergalactic establishment encountered in the original *Star Wars* movie.

The game takes several hours to play and doesn't always end successfully. If you get picked up by the planetary police, come face to face with the Galactic Patrol, or bump into other dangerous characters (Hok Tuey, for instance, who is sought by the Stambulian Police Department for armed robbery and assault), the results could be detrimental to your health.

Steal an air car and the sentence is ten years in the salt mines. Run out of fist power and your brain could end up on display, pickled for posterity in a jar filled with Stambulian preservative. It's fortunate that a save option lets you quit in midgame and resume later at the same spot.

THE FUTURE IS NOW

If you're looking for an excuse to purchase a CD-ROM drive and a Macintosh IIsi, Spaceship Warlock may be all the incentive you need. Violence, macho stereotypes, and foul language aside, this product is a feat of masterful programming.

More than 125 megabytes' worth of 8-bit (256-color) high-resolution graphics images are presented in wide-screen letterbox format to heighten the cinematic effect and minimize load times. (They're occasionally difficult to see, though, because they're a bit dark.) The three-dimensional animation sets a new standard for entertainment-software display, as does the slick, pulsating jazz-style musical score. Digitized speech and authentic sound effects transport you from the 20th-century desktop into a futuristic world so real, you'll find yourself reaching for a seat belt to prevent motion sickness during blastoff.

As for technical details, to start the program under System 7.0, you need 3.8 megabytes of free RAM (that's memory over and above what the system is using) plus the Control Panel configured with 32-bit addressing and virtual memory turned off. Reactor recommends a CD-ROM drive with an access time of 380 milliseconds or faster for best results. I tested the product on an original AppleCD SC (500 milliseconds access time) and experienced no major setbacks or noticeable slowdown in animation run time. Regrettably, this hypertext-like movie doesn't play on a Macintosh LC equipped with only a 12-inch display monitor.

Documentation for Spaceship Warlock is skimpy at best. There are no hints to help you work around the seemingly impossible dead ends. Yet, this epic adventure represents a new level for Macintosh CD-ROM entertainment because of its size, 3D graphics, animation quality, and musical score. Now if we can only get the game's designers to make the simulation easier to win.

LEARNING CURVE

SPREADING THE WORD

How can we bring technology into classrooms when school districts are going bankrupt?

By DAVID D. THORNBURG, Ph.D.

s educators, we face a unique challenge: adopt and adapt new technologies into our teaching, or cease to be relevant in the lives of our students. I see no other choice — rapid developments in inexpensive consumer information technologies, such as the Sony Data Discman released last month for under \$600, are ensuring that at least some students have far greater access to information outside the classroom than in it. But how can we bring technology into classrooms when school districts



are going bankrupt and most vendors seem to be concentrating their new technologies at the high end of the food chain? The answer is to take advantage of the free — or nearly free — technology that's already within the reach of most educators in this country.

ALL THE NEWS THAT FITS

One example is instructional television delivered through cable. While homes pay a few dollars a month for basic cable, most cable companies provide this service to schools at no cost, making the wealth of programming offered by The Discovery Channel, Bravo, CNN, Arts &

Entertainment, PBS, The Learning Channel, and Mind Extension University (to name just a few) available for presentation in classrooms.

In addition, many information providers are members of the Cable in the Classroom consortium, dedicated to the provision of commercial-free programming for educational use, often including teacher guides, videotaping rights, and the right to maintain copies of tapes in classroom libraries.

All it takes is a cable drop that may already be in your classroom.

If you have an Apple IIe, IIc, or Macintosh in the classroom, your local cable vendor can probably provide access to another service that justifies cable use, even if you never watch television. X*PRESS Information Services (800-7PC-NEWS) crams the contents of numerous wire services (AP, TASS, Kyodo, and many others), along with classroom guides to CNN and other TV offerings, some public-domain software, shareware, and financial information, onto a special channel you receive through a one-way modem. (In addition, Mac users will soon be able to receive a multimedia database, known as The Media Centre, featuring interactive classroom activities supported by color images and sound.)

The modem extracts the coded information from your cable at 9600 baud and ships it to your computer, where you can access it with the X*Change software provided with the unit. (Hardware incompatibilities prevent the IIGs from working with the system; IIes require a serial card.) This information service is part of the basic cable offering in many areas — you may already have X*PRESS signals coming into your school.

Call your cable provider to see whether the company will donate the modem. Some cable services, such as TCI and Heritage, will provide up to two complete setups (modems, cables, and software) per school site at no cost. But even if you have to pay for the modem, it's pretty reasonable — under \$100 (including cables and software) for the Apple II version, about \$125 for the Mac edition. You'll also want a printer, although you can save the information you've received in a format readable by AppleWorks.

Once you're set up, the software lets you establish categories for information you want to retrieve — weather, news, and so on. The more categories you choose, the faster you'll run out of storage space, but you can trade off breadth for depth by customizing your information stream — extracting only local weather, for example, or news from a specific area. Your computer will scan the header of each incoming story to see whether it fits one of your categories, in

which case it will download the material. You can browse at any time through the stories already received and print them or save them to disk. As you delete stories from the computer, space is freed up for more stories to be downloaded.

If you have an old Apple IIe gathering dust in the closet, you may want to dedicate a computer just for the X*PRESS service and leave it on all the time. Just be sure to have students save and delete the RAM-based files frequently to make room for new information.

THE CHALLENGE

Imagine the impact of this technology on a current-events class. News from TASS on the latest changes in the Soviet Union, for example, streams into your classroom computer at the same time these stories are appearing in newsrooms around the world. Students can collect articles, decide which ones are newsworthy, and create their own daily newspaper. That night, students can watch the evening news to see how the networks deal with the same information. Because wire services from many countries are represented, students get to see the way newspeople from each culture may interpret a given event in its own way - coloring the story as they cover it.

Many schools have cable access, but sometimes teachers don't know it. In addition, many educators lack the time to keep up with all the new technology available. The major challenge in educational restructuring today is not only to bring technology into the classroom, but to provide effective communication on using it with students. The slow pace of technology adoption in the classroom may have less to do with money than with a lack of staff awareness.

If you're a teacher, or know someone who is, spread the word that "multimedia" technology is at our fingertips for free. As Mark Twain said, "Those who don't read have no advantage over those who can't."

PROMPTS ON THE MENU

AppleWorks' nested-file-card menu interface makes this package probably the easiest to use, the most logical, of any 8-bit Apple II product — and one of the most imitated. That simplicity of operation comes at a price, though — the time it takes to negotiate up and down through all those menus. If you've enhanced your Apple-Works program with Beagle Bros' TimeOut UltraMacros, though, you can take advantage of some dramatic shortcuts.

This month we'll use a "message menu" to unite October's three file-creation macros under a single keystroke. (See "Automated AppleWorks: Fast File Creation," Hints, October 1991, p. 64.) A message menu is an on-screen macro series that prompts you to press one of several keys, selecting some particular action. The keypress is then "trapped" in a macro variable, and the macro determines what happens next. We'll use three special techniques to set it up: 1. First, create a message to appear on the dashed line at the bottom of the Apple-Works screen with the <msg> command. Within the macro, the text of the message must be enclosed in quotes — double for standard text, single for inverse — and must always be followed by a colon. < Msg ""> erases the previous message.

- 2. Next, define a variable to "capture" the ASCII value of the key to be pressed (as in <k = key>), with two effects:
- a. This action "pauses" AppleWorks so that the keypress isn't passed along to the program as usual. This way, the macro can

use keypresses for tasks other than AppleWorks text or command entry.

- b. It makes the key's value available for manipulation by the macro; you can use message prompts as menus, offering the user a choice of actions determined by the key he or she presses.
- 3. If/then/else logic enables the computer to determine which course of action to follow. In this case, the captured keystroke indicates the action, so the macro examines that information to make its choice. The macro compares the actual content of the variable to criteria provided by the macro author (you). In this macro we use the equal sign (=), so action follows an exact match only.

Include this macro in your default set, along with the three from October. Recompile the set and save it again as your default, and any new file is just two keypresses away.

AND NOW FOR SOMETHING COMPLETELY DIFFERENT . . .

For those of you who are wintering on the links down South (and away from computers), here's a tip: When you get up close to the green, don't get stuck in a pitching-wedge mentality. Sure, if you're in the rough, you want the sand wedge, because it gives you the most consistency, but if you're on the first cut and you've got a little green to work with, try different clubs. Take a five- or a seven-iron, choke up, take a nice, easy swing, and think about getting the ball rolling on the green with as little air time as possible. Be careful the first few times you try this, because the ball won't have any backspin and will roll a lot farther than you'd expect. - Paul Boulé





ONCE UPON A TIME

Ever wonder if computer games *have* to be slower and harder to play than Nintendo? They don't. Gate proves it.

ate is an anachronism — a game that might have been written for the Apple IIGs five years ago. A castle riddled with labyrinths, a prisoner who escapes and must save a bewitched kingdom, magic spells and buried treasure — there's nothing new about any of this. You're charged with the battle against ghosts, magicians, snakes, and other slimy, evil things. You have to sneak through mazes as you seek the gate to the castle's next story. It's the stuff of countless video games. So what makes Gate special?

What's special is that Gate exists at all. The large North American game companies, such as Sierra On-Line and Electronic Arts, no longer write new games for the Apple IIGs. The future of computer games seems to be a machine called Nintendo.

It's fair to compare Gate to a Nintendo game because the new Nintendo Super Entertainment machine just happens to run on the very microprocessor chip the HGs uses: the 65816. Ever wonder whether computer games have to be slower and harder to play than

Nintendo games? They don't. Gate proves it. Gate also looks a lot like Gauntlet, a game that may still be playing at your local pizza parlor or video arcade. Gauntlet lets

you choose your character from a cast, but

it doesn't offer much intellectual stimulation. Gate is more challenging than an arcade game — it requires you to solve riddles and puzzles. You need your head as much as your trigger finger. (If you know what this is — "The more it grows, the less

it is" — please write to "The Game Guys," *inCider/A+*, 80 Elm Street, Peterborough, NH 03458.) Gate has a certain enigmatic appeal. (Apple He/Hc and Macintosh owners who like the sound of Gate will be happy to learn that Gauntlet is still available for \$14.95 from Mindscape USA, Chicago, Illinois, 312-525-1500.)

Gate has fewer levels than Gauntlet, but there's plenty of action: After sneaking out of a seven-story palace, you still face three mysterious shrines (if you can find them). You can save a game in progress, too.

We did all we could to get to the end, "to find Darg, the master of Fire, and defeat him in a duel in order to restore peace to Divesia," but we never quite uncovered the rascal. We came close because there were two of us — one joystick sharpshooter, two riddle unravelers. But we couldn't have climbed out of the third subbasement without saving a game or two.

Drawbacks are typical of Free Tools Association products (including the popular game Photonix): You can't load Gate onto your hard drive, because it doesn't use GS/OS. Of course, that also makes Gate fast. The graphics images are colorful and quick; the music is bright and moves the action along.

The documentation is sketchy: It's best to learn Gate's ins and outs by flipping to the help screens. Gate runs on ROM 01 and ROM 03 Apple Hoses; it requires only a single 3.5-inch drive and 1 megabyte of memory. It sells for \$59, plus a \$5 shipping fee.

The best thing that could happen to Gate would be adoption by a benevolent North American distributor with a desire to make a few bucks — a company that could drop the price and simplify Gate's distribution to Americans and Canadians.

Who knows? Maybe if some brave programmer had written Gate in 1986 and had dared to create some other exciting, addictive games for the Apple IIGs in the year of its birth, we might be celebrating the Super Apple IIGs in 1991, not the Nintendo Super Entertainment System. Boot up Gate and see what your IIGS is really made of.
